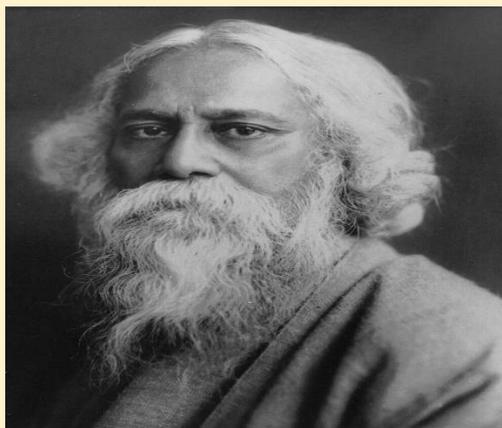

The BA General degree course of sociology in Bamunpukur Humayun Kabir Mahavidyalaya, BHKM began its journey from the early days of the college and has continued for over a decade as a General subject. There is demand amongst students in opting for sociology as a General subject. In 2021-22 there were 705 students and currently there are 589 students in 2022-23. There is only one full time permanent faculty teaching in Sociology. The rooms allotted for Department of Sociology are Room No: 13 and Room No: 34.

The objectives of the BA General Course Programme in Sociology, BHKM are as follows:

- ▶ *To develop understanding of sociology as a discipline*
- ▶ *To impart theoretical and empirical understanding of the subject to its students;*
- ▶ *To help students take up sociology as a subject for appearing in competitive examinations*

Objectives of Library Day Observation:

- i) To acquaint students with the books in the library
- ii) To acquaint students how to study a book, how to cite it, where to look for the details etc.
- iii) To create an interest in reading from books in the age of digital devices

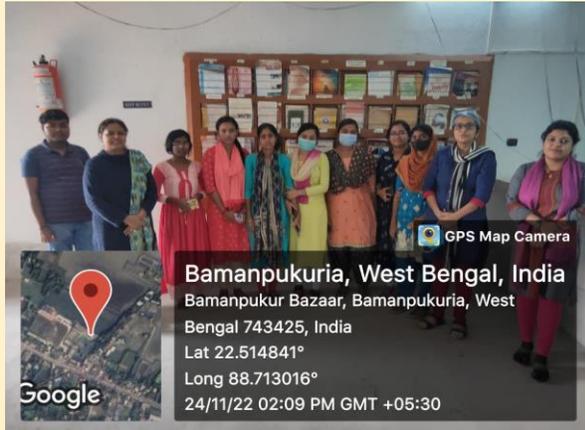
The Context:

Research shows us that it is not possible to transmit understanding to students by simply telling them what they need to know. Instead, teachers need to make sure that they challenge their students' thinking. With active learning, students build knowledge and understanding in response to opportunities provided by their teacher. It helps to improve metacognition and self-efficacy. Introduced as a best practice in the Department from academic year 2019, the purpose of observation of library day is to promote active learning methods and experiential learning methods.

Title of the Practice: Seminars and Innovative Practices

Objectives of Seminars:

- i) Learning about new topics in Sociology motivates and encourages students to learn more
- ii) Student seminars aid students in gaining information about how seminars work, how things take place, enhances their confidence in communication skills and promotes performance and productivity
- iii) Innovative practices broaden the scope of learning and helps bridge gaps between teaching and learning

The Context:

Most of the young graduates lack the confidence and fluency while interacting verbally. Coming from rural background many students hold good academic records and individual skills but lack behind in expressing themselves. Speaking about a research topic in a seminar before a gathered audience boosts the confidence of the students preparing them for interviews and group discussion. Also seminars provide a chance to interact with experts from the specific discipline. Discussing the relevant topics of the particular subject, students learn about the latest information and new skills related to the concerned subject. Moreover since learning environment of seminars are different and unique from classrooms, students feel interested which in turn enhances confidence and promotes performance and productivity. To this end, students are encouraged to take up peer learning as evident in student to student learning program or their coming together to express their own ideology as demonstrated in their protest against racism in the aftermath of the brutal killing of George Floyd.

Title of the Practice: Publication of Departmental Newsletter *Sociological Illuminations*

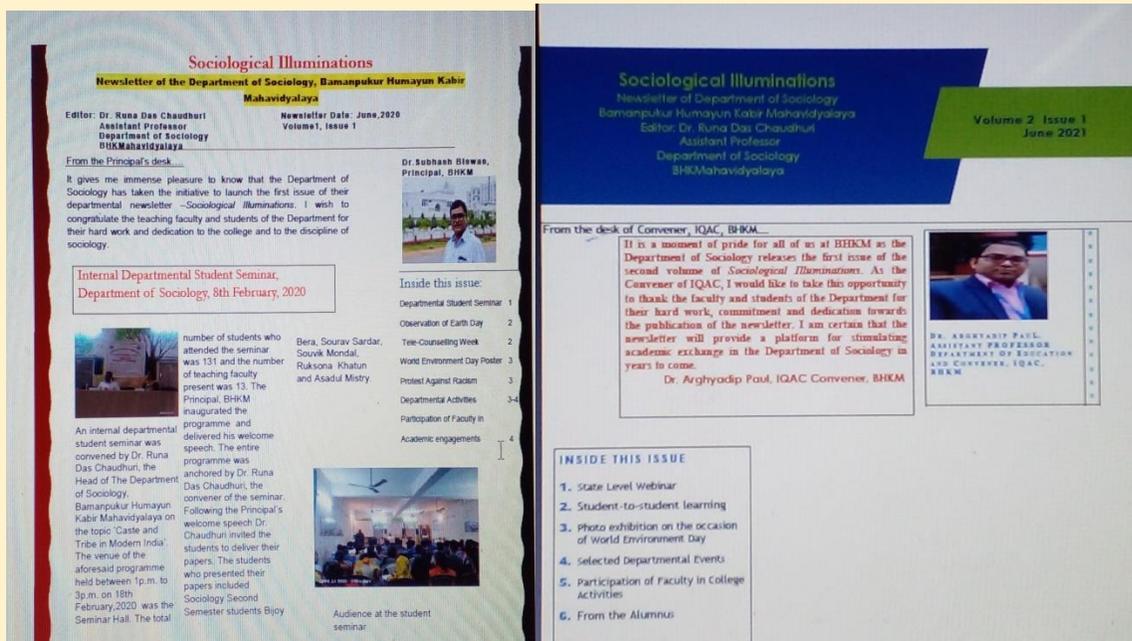
The Context:
